## VTIFF Announces 2014 Selections for the Vermont Filmmakers' Showcase™

Burlington, VT: (September 30, 2014): The Vermont International Film Foundation (VTIFF) is pleased to announce this year's selections for the Vermont Filmmakers' Showcase™. The showcase, sponsored by Ben & Jerry's, is part of the 2014 Vermont International Film Festival, taking place October 24 − November 2 in downtown Burlington. The films will be screened on Friday, October 24 and Saturday October 25 in the Main Street Landing Black Box Theater. Screenings are open to the public, with donations accepted to support the Film Foundation. ## About the Vermont Filmmakers' Showcase™:

VTIFF celebrates Vermont filmmaking with our annual Vermont Filmmakers' Showcase™, the oldest and largest juried presentation of Vermont films in the state. The showcase takes place annually during the Vermont International Film Festival. All genres, styles and lengths are accepted. There is no fee for Vermont films or videos submitted.

All films in the Showcase must have been completed within 12 months of the festival's submission deadline. Works in progress cannot be submitted, and applicant must be a senior creative team member on the work submitted (producer, director, writer or DoP). The applicant must be a resident of Vermont or a student at a Vermont educational institution at the time of submitting the film.

The selected films will be screened at the Vermont International Film Festival and will be eligible for a range of awards. The 2014 Awards are:

The James Goldstone Award, a \$500 cash award given to an emerging Vermont filmmaker and

sponsored by the Vermont Film Commission.

The Ben & Jerry Award, a \$300 cash prize given to recognize and support a Vermont filmmaker who,

through the lens, documented and raised awareness of an important social or environmental issue with

verve and ingenuity

The Footage Farm USA Award, a credit for stock footage worth \$600 from the Footage Farm collection

given to a Vermont Documentary Filmmaker who, through film, strives to raise questions about the world

we live in.

The VCAM Audience Favorite Award - \$200 by popular ballot

The VTIFF awards for Best Cinematography, Best Screenwriting, Best Acting.

The festival is best known for featuring groundbreaking and independent films from around the world and Vermont and for the Vermont Filmmakers' Showcase™, the largest juried selection of Vermont-made films.
