Exclusive Burlington Area Theatrical Screening of Louder Than Bombs on November 19th

After the screening, there will be discussion lead by Burlington Film Society members.

An upcoming exhibition celebrating photographer Isabelle Reed three years after her untimely death, brings her eldest son Jonah back to the family house - forcing him to spend more time with his father Gene and withdrawn younger brother Conrad than he has in years. With the three of them under the same roof, Gene tries desperately to connect with his two sons, but they struggle to reconcile their feelings about the woman they remember so differently.

About The Filmmakers

Joachim Trier (director, co-writer) is an internationally celebrated director and screenwriter. His critically acclaimed and award-winning feature films *Reprise* (2006) and *Oslo, August 31st* (2011), both co-written with Eskil Vogt, have won awards at international film festivals including Cannes, Sundance, Toronto, Karlovy Vary, Gothenburg, Milan, and Istanbul. *Oslo, August 31st* was selected for Un Certain Regard at the Cannes Film Festival in 2011 and nominated for the César award for Best Foreign Film 2013 after reaching over 180,000 admissions at theatres in France. *Reprise* received the 2007 Amanda Award (Norway's top film prize) for Best Norwegian Film, Best Director and Best Script. The film was released in the U.S. by Miramax and was the Norwegian Oscar candidate for Best Foreign Film in 2006. Hailed as "a sublimely natural talent," Trier was named one of "20 Directors to Watch" by the New York Times in 2013. *Louder Than Bombs* is his English language debut.

Eskil Vogt (co-writer) is a Norwegian film director and screenwriter whose films include *Reprise* and *Oslo, August 31st*, directed by Joachim Trier with screenplays co-written by Vogt and Trier. He wrote and directed the drama *Blind*, which screened at the 2014 Sundance Film Festival, where it received the World Cinema Screenwriting Award. The film also screened at the 64th Berlin International Film Festival.

Main Street Landing is an environmentally and socially conscious redevelopment company in Burlington, Vermont that has created over 250,000 square feet of built environment on the Burlington Waterfront. The Film House, located at 60 Lake Street is used primarily for film screenings and presentations. It is equipped with a large screen that covers west facing windows, control room, Dolby surround sound, retractable screen, and smart podium and can fit up to 220 people.
